Project staff will review your application and respond to your proposal as soon as possible. If your grant request is approved, you will receive a check for 25% of your grant request. Once you have completed your field work and completed the atlas block survey, send us a short end of the season report (can be a simple paragraph or two) summarizing your survey efforts and results. Project staff will review your report to make sure that adequate efforts were made to complete the atlas block, and if approved, the remaining 75% of your grant will be mailed to you.
